Parental Advisory Council Chair Report - Annual General Meeting June 19th, 2023



This school year started out with some apprehension and uncertainly, however it ended with normalcy and familiarity. We started the year in September with no restrictions in place, but not knowing if or when the restrictions would return. We were slow and hesitant to plan too far into the year due to the risk of cancelling our plans. However, we managed to get through the entire school year with no restrictions.

We were able to run a number of fundraisers during the year to support our school initiative, and these will be outlined in the Fundraising Report.

We held three Scholastic book fairs during the year. Our fall book fair saw \$150 rewarded to each division to purchase books for the classroom. The spring bookfair raised \$2,045 in rewards to be purchased for the LLC. The BOGO book fair that is held every year at Family Fun Night did not hit the \$1,500 sales amount that is required to earn rewards. Our BOGO book fair is not used as a fundraiser, however it is used to make sure our students have plenty of books to read over the summer. A huge thank you to Michelle Bastien and Michelle Mitchell for co-chairing the Book Fair Committee. All your hard work every year does not go unnoticed. Also, a huge thank you to all of our parents that volunteer countless hours to ensure the book fair runs smoothly.

Once again, we supported our classrooms by providing a \$200 budget so staff could purchase consumable supplies. The recipients of the \$200 were each division, ELL, LLC, LLS, SEL and gym. We also supported our student's learning by purchasing 11 classroom licenses for RAZ kids. By purchasing RAZ kids, our children are able to take what they are reading in the classroom home with them at the end of the day. The PAC received staff requests for the purchase of more noise cancelling headphones, additional flexible seating and supplies for a new kindergarten classroom. All requests were granted.

We supported field trips again this year by allocating \$10 per student from our BC Gaming grant to cover the cost of transportation.

In addition to the funds that the Grade 5 Committee has fundraised, the PAC donated \$1,000 towards the purchase of their hoodies and year books. This is a tradition that has continued on for many years.

The PAC thanked our staff this year by hosting two staff appreciation luncheons. We held a Christmas luncheon in December and a year end luncheon at the beginning of June. A huge thank you to Michelle Bastien, Michelle Mitchell, Jen Pratap and Joni Witmer for helping me put everything together to host the luncheons.

The PAC has continued to support our families helping the school run a drive thru drop-off and pick-up every day. This service would not be possible without the combined volunteer time of 358 hours by our amazing Highlighter team. A million thank yous to Michelle Bastien, Cheryle Dahiroc, Ashley Camp, Amy Condie, Sarah Ferraro, Andrew Geddert and Bryanna Duclos for the countless hours they have spent out

Prince Charles Elementary Parental Advisory Council Meeting Treasurer's Report – Annual General Meeting June 19, 2023

This was a fun school year as we eased back into a normal type of year. We kicked the year off with our first Welcome Back BBQ in September since 2019.

Coupon books were sold virtually this year, there were two Purdy's fundraisers, Art Cards fundraiser, poinsettia fundraiser, hot lunch and popcorn days in the Winter, Fall and Spring terms, and finally, a Family Fun Night. We also held 2 Scholastic Book Fairs and Movie Night events. We were able to provide our school with \$3974.70 in rewards to be used towards books and supplies for our classrooms and LLC.

The BC Gaming grant that we received this year was \$6,000, which equates to \$20 per student that was registered at Prince Charles in September 2021 (300 students). This year, gaming funds were spent on bussing for field trips (\$1,430 to date) and a sandbox for the Kindergarten playground (\$1,500). A balance of \$13,593.24 remains in the gaming account and will be spent during the 2023/24 school year.

This year we gave back to the school from our general account in the following ways:

- Noise cancelling headphones for the grade 3 & 4 students
- \$1,000 donation to the grade 5 class
- \$1,000 budget for the LLC
- \$300 budget for the Leadership students

- Supplies for a new Kindergarten room
- · Birthday gifts for staff
- Treats for World Teachers Day
- · Staff Christmas and year-end lunch

Prince Charles Elementary Parental Advisory Council DPAC Report – Annual General Meeting June 19, 2023

All general meetings were held virtually this year and the AGM was held in-person in May. At each of the monthly meetings there were representatives from District staff who provided a presentation. The presentations included Assistant Superintendent Carla Danielsson and Trustee Shirley Wilson in September where they discussed new students coming from Afghanistan, and the history of Strong Start in the district amongst other topics. October was Assistant Superintendent Gino Bondi and Trustee Preet Rai where there was discussion on the operational plan for Abbotsford Secondary Schools, focusing on inquiry-based learning experiences. November district presenters were Superintendent Dr. Kevin Godden and Trustee Korky Neufeld who provided updates on the school experience, Afghan refugees, the affordability fund, teacher staff shortages, child and youth mental health and attendance rates. The next DPAC meeting was held in January 2023 where the updates were provided by Assistant Superintendent Nathan Ngieng and Trustee Stan Petersen. The focus was on middle school success, inquiry-based learning, the Equity framework and the districts commitment to Truth and Reconciliation. A video was shared titled "Student Voice in our Middle School" focusing on changes to promote our students feeling valued and heard. The second part of the presentation focused on the District Career Programs. February's meeting had presentations by Director of Instruction Kat Hannah around the Learning Support Services department. Trustee Mike Rauch was also in attendance. April's meeting included Assistant Superintendent Perry Smith, who provided an update om Student Progress Reporting Order. Trustee Jared White was also in attendance.

DPAC partnered with the Abbotsford School District this year to start a Parent Night series. This year the series included a presentation from Dr. Jean Clinton called Rising to Resilience. The second presentation was Cybersafe from Exploitation. A full line-up of 8 presentations is slated from the 2023/24 school year so stay tuned for more information.

BCCPAC's Conference and AGM was attended by Shannon Rose and Michelle Bastien and was held May 5^{th} to 7^{th} , 2023. DPAC was able to obtain proxies from 28 of the 46 schools in Abbotsford and Shannon and Michelle were able to vote on their behalf. Abbotsford had a strong voice at the election, which was amazing.
